The Harpenden Pipe Band was formed by Bob Renwick in 1997 with only 5 Pipers, 2 side Drummers and a Bass Drummer, and very quickly rose to become a significant presence in the area. Harpenden Pipe Band originally wore Hamilton tertan kilts prior to purchasing the present tartan, Ancient Maclinnes. In 1998, the band made its debut at the Harpenden-Highland Gathering. By 1999 more members had joined and by 2000 the band had grown substantially. More importantly some junior members had joined.

The Bedford Pipe Band was formed in October 1993 by Donald Reid, the current Pipe Major, following requests from several people to be taught piping. In the early days there were no drummers and all that we were really doing was to learn the basics on the practice chanter using the College of Piping tutor. In 1994 a meeting was held to adopt a constitution for the formal formation of Bedford Pipe Band. Interestingly it was about this time that it was learnt that there had been an earlier Bedford Pipe Band, formed just after the Second World War by pipers returning from active service. With the kind permission of Struan Robertson, chief of the Clan Donnachaidh, the band weers the Red Robertson tartan.

# **The Heavy Events**

These events, which are also known as Highland Games, will take place in the main arena.

#### **Putting the Stone**

Every Highland Gathering had its own unique stone which might vary in weight between 16lb and 28lb (7.3kg and 12.7kg). The stone is putted with one hand only from the neck. A run, glide or spin not exceeding 7ft 6ins (2.3m) is allowed up to the trig (stop board) which is a length of wood 4ft 6ins (1.4m) long and six inches (15cm) high.



#### Weight Over the Bar



The weight is a steel or lead weight, attached to a metal circular handle. The weight is thrown one-handed over a bar set at increasing heights above the thrower. The thrower has three attempts for each successive height. Places are determined by maximum height reached with the fewest misses. The size of the weight varies with the competition class. Advanced male athletes throw a 56ib (25.5kg) weight, female athletes throw a 28ib (12.7kg) weight and male master class or senior athletes throw a 42ib (19kg) weight.

#### Weight for Distance - 28lb & 56lb

Said to be one of the most graceful of heavyweight events, there are two standard weights - the 28lb (2 stone, or 12.7kg) and the 56lb (4 stone, or 25.5kg). The weight consists of a 28lb/56lb ball/block, chain and handle, the overall length of which must not exceed 18 inches (45.7cm). The Harpenden hammer weighs 24lb (10.9kg). In simple terms the thrower grasps the weight in one hand, spins round and throws it as far as possible. More accurately, the thrower has a distance of nine feet (2.75m) behind the trig (stop board) from which to throw the weight. Grasping the weight and facing the trig, he swings the weight to the side and then behind him. He's now ready to start his throw which consists of three turns, gathering momentum on each. On the third, and at exactly the right moment, he heaves the weight as far as he can. The thrower stands with his back to the trig, swings the hammer round his head to gather momentum and then releases it over his shoulder.

#### Tossing the Sheaf

The sheaf toss is a traditional Scottish agricultural sport event originally contested at country fairs. A pitchfork is used to hurt a hessian bag stuffed with straw over a horizontal bar above the competitor's head. Typical weight for the bag is 16 pounds (about 7 kg). Three chances are given to each competitor to cleanly go over the bar, without touching it. After all challengers have made their attempts, the bar is raised, and all successful competitors move on to the new height. This continues until all but one athlete is eliminated.

#### Tossing The Caber

The dimensions of a caber can vary enormously but the norm is about 150lb (68kg), 18 ft (5.5m) long and about 9 in (23cm) thick at one end, tapering to about 5 in (13cm) at the other. Contrary to popular belief, it is not thrown for distance but for style. The judge will set the caber on its end with the thickest portion in the air. The athlete rests it against his shoulder and, clasping his arms around it, lifts it up off the ground whilst keeping it perfectly balanced. When he's achieved that, he will give it a quick flick up and move his hands under the narrow end. He's now ready to throw it.

The competition is judged using an imaginary clock-face on the ground in front of the thrower with him facing the 12 o'clock position. The clock-face keeps pace with him as he runs. When he has reached the desired speed, he will stop abruptly and heave the caber up so that its heavy end lands in the middle of the clock and the whole caber turns right over, ending up with the narrow end pointing exactly towards 12 o'clock.

#### Hurling the Haggis

Modern haggis throwing or hurling is judged on the basis of distance and accuracy of the hurl. A split or burst haggis is immediately disqualified, as the haggis must be fit to eat after landing. The sport requires subtle technique rather than brute force, as the hurl must result in a gentle landing to keep the haggis skin intact. There is a World Haggis Hurling Championship. Plans to use a take haggis in a hurling competition at a Highland festival in Melbourne have split the purists from those who are fearful of the mess a high-speed impacting may cause.

The haggis should be of traditional construction, consisting of a tender boiled sheep's heart, lung and liver with spices, onions, suet and oatmeal and stock stuffed in a sheep's paunch, boiled for three hours. At the time of hurling the haggis should be cooled and inspected to ensure no firming agents have been applied. Rules dictate that the haggis must be packed tight and secure, with no extra "skin" or "flab". The aporting haggis weighs 500 grams, with a maximum diameter of 18 cm and length of 22 cm. An allowance of ±30 grams is given, and this weight is used in both junior and middle weight events.

At the Harpenden Highland Gathering we use a traditional haggis but, in the interest of good hygiene and to prevent splitting and spillage on impact, it is wrapped in plastic and frozen prior to the competition.

The Haggis Hurling Competition is open to all - both children and adults are encouraged to take part! Please register at the Announcers' tent no later than 14:30 hrs.

# **Highland Dancing**

Highland Dancing is regarded as one of the most sophisticated forms of national dancing in the world. The standard highland dances traditionally featured in competitions are: the Highland

Fling, Sword Dance, Seann Triubhas, Strathspey, and the Highland Reel or Reel of Tulloch.

The Highland Fling is probably the most famous of Scottish dances. Thought to have originated about 1790, legend has it that an old shepherd was giving chanter lessons to his grandson when he saw a stag rearing and wheeling in the near distance. The dance is performed on the same spot throughout because the clansmen of old danced on their targe (leather-covered, studded shield).

The Sword Dance is said to have originated in 1054 when King Malcolm Canmore clashed in battle near Dunsinane with one of Macbeth's chiefs. Having slain his opponent, Malcolm crossed his claymore with that of his opponent to make the sign of the cross and danced in exultation over them.

The Seann Triubhas (pronounced shawn trews) is said to reflect the Highlander's desire to shake off the hated Sassenach trousers that Scots were forced to wear when the kilt was prohibited after the 1745 rebellion.

The Reel of Tulloch originated in the northeast village of Tulloch one winter morning long ago when the minister was late. The assembled congregation, waiting outside the church, stamped their feet and clapped their hands to keep warm and as someone began to whistle a Highland air, the movements developed into a lively dance.

#### Scottish National Dancing

Scottish dancing-masters would enliven their entertainment by introducing different styles of dance. The further we look back into history, the closer the resemblance we find between Scotland and Ireland.

A "Scoto-Irish" style of dancing was in fashion in the 1790s. In Irish dancing, the footwork for solo jigs, reels and hompipes is quick and neat, the body is held rigid from the waist up, and arm movements are absent. Hebridean Solo Dances were originally composed in the 19th Century by Ewen MacLachan who had studied dancing in France. He was very interested in ballet and gained a good knowledge of that style of dancing. This can be seen in some of his dances which also demonstrate his considerable knowledge of Highland dancing. MacLachan gave his dances the names of the Scottish tunes he used.

#### Scottish Country Dancing

Whilst "Reeling" and "Cellidh" styles of dancing have been popular in Scotland for centuries and would fit the description of typical folk dancing, Scotlish Country Dancing is unique to Scotland. It was performed by all members of society in village halls and ballrooms, and the dancers dressed up for these occasions often in evening dress. Today, the Reels, Jigs and Strathspeys of Scotlish Country Dancing are performed and enjoyed all over the world. As in the past, the social character of this form of dancing is strongly emphasised.

#### **Highland Dancing Competition and Displays**

There will be Highland Dancing displays in the small arena, courtesy of The Royal Scottish Country Dance Society (RSCDS), Herts and Borders Branch, with the audience encouraged to join in!

A Highland Dancing Competition, organised by Heidi Mathers, will take place on the small stage, throughout the day. Come and watch the talented young dancers competing to be judged the best!

Everywhere things are happening, we know there is so much to watch with the pipe bands, Scottish dancing, arena events and displays but why not visit our stallholders who have so much to offert Many return year on year so look out for your favourites as well as exciting and innovative offerings from new stallholders.



As you enter the Gathering you will see the main arena straight in front of you. This is surrounded by many of the stalls. You can buy yummy cupcakes, and sweets, candy floss and food snacks. In the Scots area -stalls with a Scottish theme, including clothing and crafts, kill wearing, Clan gathering - can be found.







## Harpenden Lions Club Highland Gathering

#### Background and History

Described as a "fun day out with a Scottish flavour for the whole family" the Gathering is Harpenden Lions Club's largest annual fundraising event. It raises thousands of pounds annually for local, national and international charities and good causes.

St. Albans and Mid-Herts Caledonian Society organised the first of the local Highland Games which took place on 22 June 1946 at Beech Hyde Farm, Wheathampstead. It was held as a fundraising event to assist Scottish engineers who had been working in aircraft factories including De Havilland in Hatfield during the Second World War. On 1 June1949, further Games were held in Clarence Park, St. Albans, From 1950 onwards the Games were held in Rothamsted Park, Harpenden, where the natural bowl-shaped area proved ideal for the staging of the event. Typically, they started at about 10:30am, with solo piping and dancing. By midday, spectators would spread picnics on the grass. No doubt a few drams, pints (and cups!) were downed in the process. The official part of the Games was opened in the early afternoon by the Chieftain, usually the head of a Clan.

There were many attractions on the programme, including the 'heavy' events, such as the Highland Stone, throwing the weights and harmers, and tossing the caber and the sheaf, many of which will be seen this year. These were followed by the pipe bands giving displays individually and in massed formation. A newspaper article referring to the early days mentions 'picking up the inevitable beer cans and other rubbish - no matter how many or how large were the rubbish skips provided - dismantling the platforms and removing the picket fencing which had not always been a sufficient deterrent to the determined gatecrasher'. Nothing changes – ask any member of the Lions Club or the local youth organisations without whose support the event would not be possible!

The Games flourished in this established format until 1972. From 1973 Rothamsted Park was not available. Alternative venues in Hertford and Letchworth were found for the following two years, but after that the Games ceased.

The first of the modern games, organised by Harpenden Lions Club, took place on June 22 1996, at Harpenden Rugby Club. The following year they relocated back to their traditional home in Rothamsted Park. The Harpenden Highland Gathering is now one of the largest Gatherings outside Scotland and raises thousands of pounds for charitable purposes every year. Many charities set up stalls and displays to raise awareness of their work and attract donations. Since 1996 the event has taken place on an annual basis and gone from strength to strength. Even the disappointing weather of 2012 failed to stop the Gathering, which despite the understandable fall in attendance, still raised over £12,000 for the beneficiaries, although in 2020 the coronavirus pandemic did force cancellation. The Highland Gathering returned in 2021 - the 25th event since its revival by Harpenden Lions Club.

What makes the Harpenden Highland Gathering such a special occasion? Spectacular pipe band displays, dance, traditional games and the sounds of the bagpipes — both traditional and in rock music - set the scene for the day, but there is much more. In recent years, visitors have enjoyed thrilling falconry demonstrations, historical re-enactments, the entertaining sight of experienced sheepdogs herding geese and ducklings, ferret racing and scouts cannon races! Introduced in 2017, the "Hurling the Haggis" event has become a great success, Every year there are plenty of events for children, including novelty track events, a climbing wall, Go-Karts and other attractions. There is a wide selection of stalls offering refreshments, and many others selling craft and novelty items.

## **HOW TO FIND US, WHERE TO PARK!**

The Highland Gathering is held in Rothamsted Park, Leyton Road, Harpenden - a few minutes walk along Station Road from Harpenden Railway Station. Use postcode AL5 2LX for satnavs.



## Driving from the North or from the M1 motorway J10

Exit the M1 at Junction 10 and take the A1081 to Harpenden (approx. 4.5 miles). Proceed along the High Street to the end of the town, straight across the mini roundabout at The Harpenden Arms. At the next roundabout, go straight across passing The Silver Cup on the right. Within 50 yards turn left into the car park.

## Driving from the South (Note: left turn only at entrance to car park)

Proceed through St. Albans and take the A1081 to Harpenden (approx. 4 miles). Reverse direction at the Silver Cup roundabout, to enter the car park on your left.

OR If coming from M1 J9 proceed south along the A5183 until you reach the Redbourn roundabout where you take the first exit up the hill towards Harpenden. At the next roundabout take the first exit, then change direction at the Silver Cup roundabout, as above.

#### Station Car Park

Free car parking is also available at Harpenden Station, courtesy of Thameslink (no need to display a ticket). Please use the town-side car park (entrance before railway bridge).

#### **Disabled Parking**

Limited spaces are available inside the park (see Event Layout). The gate attendants will direct you. Please clearly display your blue badge.

If there are no free spaces left, the driver should drop you off at the gate in Leyton Road and park in the main car park.
